### Rabbi's Article

In modern life we must all keep up with new developments. We can never rest on our past accomplishments. Doctors need re-certification credits to keep their licenses current, and the same applies to most every profession. Continuing (or permanent) education is a necessity and a reality in every walk of life. Everyone understands this, except in what relates to Judaism. It seems that many of us assume that all they need to learn for a healthy and inspiring spiritual life can be learned by age 13. For others who never went to Hebrew School, even that doesn't seem necessary. Then organized Jewry beats its collective chest and wonders why we face such a high rate of assimilation and why are so many Jewish adults indifferent to Judaism.

Somehow, at some point, the People of the Book seem to have lost its love for the book (that is the Jewish book). In a way we fulfilled again the tragic prophesy of Jeremiah (2:13) "For My people have committed two evils: They have abandoned Me, the fountain of living waters, and hewed ... broken cisterns that can hold no water ..."

But we should not despair. In our congregation we have many opportunities to keep growing spiritually and to learn about our history and traditions. Our Adult Education program is expanding its offerings both in scheduling options and subjects. I have just registered for my 8<sup>th</sup> Wheels of Love bike ride to raise funds for the children of ALYN Hospital in Jerusalem. Since last year's ride, I've had surgery to repair a torn meniscus in my right knee. Remarkably, I found the experience enlightening. Actually going through the pain, the recovery and the rehabilitation, I got a small glimpse into the daily struggles of the ALYN kids. How much pain can you tolerate? How can you adapt? When will life become 'normal' again? For me, the process took a few weeks. For the kids at ALYN, it is ongoing.

None of the 500 riders who spend five days covering 300 miles of wind, rain, mountains, and desert complain. Yes, we are sore and exhausted, but when you visit with the kids of ALYN before and at the end of the ride, when you see their pictures at rest stops, when you glance at their picture tags affixed to your handlebars, you put things into perspective...and you don't complain.

It's never easy to ask people to donate year after year. But for the kids of ALYN, I find

it easier and easier because each year I see the results of your giving. I truly wish each and every one of you could meet these remarkable children and what they have already accomplished in their young lives. That's why I continue to push myself up hills and across deserts. That's why I continue to push you to continue being as generous as you can. Let's make this year a really successful one—and I look forward to telling you about the miracles you've helped achieve when I return.


